SEE A TEACHER!

Academic assistance is available throughout the school day, after school and even into the evening. Did you know that the following support programs are available to you?

Help Throughout the Year

- *Extra help* sessions have been scheduled by all teachers for two days after school from 2:15 pm – 3 pm. After school activities and athletics begin at 3 pm and after school buses are available so there is no excuse not to attend!
- SGA (Small Group Assistance) is available during the school day. Middle School teachers are available during student lunch periods in the library for those seeking extra help, catching up after an absence or even enrichment! High School teachers are also in the library or special areas such as art and music room throughout the day. High school students can get assistance during study hall, lunch periods or open periods from any teacher in a department. Students should check the SGA schedule on the webpage.
- AIS (Academic Intervention Service) is provided for students during the school day based on performance on State assessments or teacher recommendation. These courses focus on preparation for required tests and support student achievement in required courses. Students who believe they could benefit from extra help should see their guidance counselor.

Support for State and National Assessments

- *Regents Review* classes will be held once a week after school from 2:15 pm – 3 pm. A special schedule will be posted as spring and the State tests approach.
- *Academic Support* classes are offered for 8 hours in the late afternoon and evening for Middle School Math and ELA Assessments, Regents examinations, and Advanced Placement exams. There are no fees for *Academic Support* classes but students must provide their own transportation. Registrations for each course are available on our web

page at ++++++ and from the course teacher as the time of the test approaches.

Students Help Students Too!

Assistance from other students is also available.

- *Math Help* offers math assistance to students during lunch periods on Wednesday. Students are also assisting middle school math teachers during extra help after school. Both of these service projects are run by the members of the high school Math Honor Society.
- *Peer Tutoring* is available by members of the National Honor Society, the Math Honor Society and the English Honor Society. Tutors can work with students after school or during the day if their schedules will allow. Students can arrange for a peer tutor through the guidance department.
